Scripture Reference: Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

Nurse's Notes

Recently I fell off from my front steps and broke my left foot in 4 places. What a shock! Not only painful but an immediate slowdown in my normal routine.

Many have felt in similar ways after a fall or injury. You find out quickly your autonomy has been violated. Accepting help is now your default setting. Let family and friends help. I know giving up control is challenging but it does not mean your incapable. Accepting help shows strength. So, say yes, even though it is hard. I know it was difficult for me, but we are vulnerable.

As we get older, we all have a fear of falling but don't let that halt a healthy lifestyle. Please continue to get together with your friends, continue with your normal activities, such as gardening and music, walk if your able, and go to the local senior center if available.

That's all good but what causes falls? It stems to our physical health. As we get older, our eyesight is less sharp, and our reflexes are not as sharp as they once were. Then there is diabetes, heart disease, problems with your thyroid, nerves in the feet or blood vessel problems. Then of course our medications can cause dizziness, sleepiness.

Scientists have linked falling with muscle weakness, problems with balance and gait, blood pressure dropping too low when standing after lying down or sitting (postural hypotension). They also say that wearing unsafe footwear such as backless shoes (flip flops, my downfall) and high

heels. Confusion can also contribute to falls.

Preventing falls include stay physically active, have eyes and hearing tested regularly, find outside effects of all your medications, get enough sleep, limit your alcohol intake, stand up slowly, use an assistive device such as a cane or a walker if you feel unsteady while walking, be careful on wet or icy surfaces, wear low heeled nonskid shoes.

Be vigilant folks in preventing falls. It's not fun being immobile for several weeks and not being able to do the activities you want to do.

New Items to be collected:

- ✓ Receiving blankets (sizes 28"x28" to 32"x32", They specify No thermal or fleece), infant washcloths, onesies or undershirts, gowns, or sleepers- sizes 0-6 mo. (they do not allow items with handprints, paw prints, or footprints please-- solid colors would be best)
- ✓ Layette Kits are sent to new mothers. Those who are fortunate enough (countries in Latin America) to receive the layette kits for their babies are extremely grateful.
